



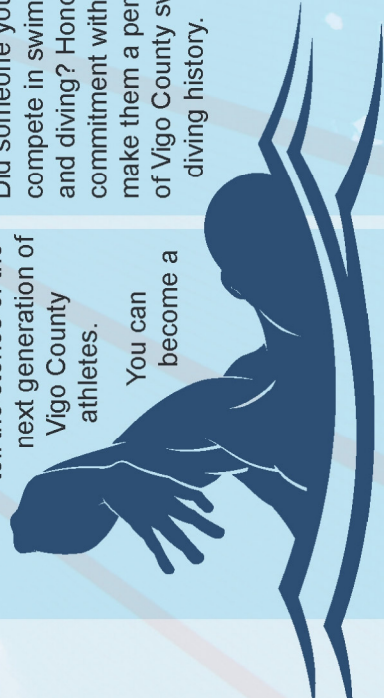
THE AQUATIC CENTER PROJECT

The Vigo County School Corporation has taken a bold next step in continuing quality swimming and diving programs. Plans are under way to construct a new 30,000 square foot facility that will be home to all three high school swimming and diving teams. The swimming pool will be a 50 meter by 25 yard Olympic competition racing surface. This includes 3 - 1 meter and 1 - 3 meter diving standards. It will also have a physical therapy pool, team locker rooms, a classroom, and spectator seating for 368 fans.

This new aquatic center will be a special place where the traditions of the Braves, Patriots, and Vikings will continue. Future press clippings and photo finishes tell the stories of the next generation of the Vigo County athletes.

BY THE NUMBERS

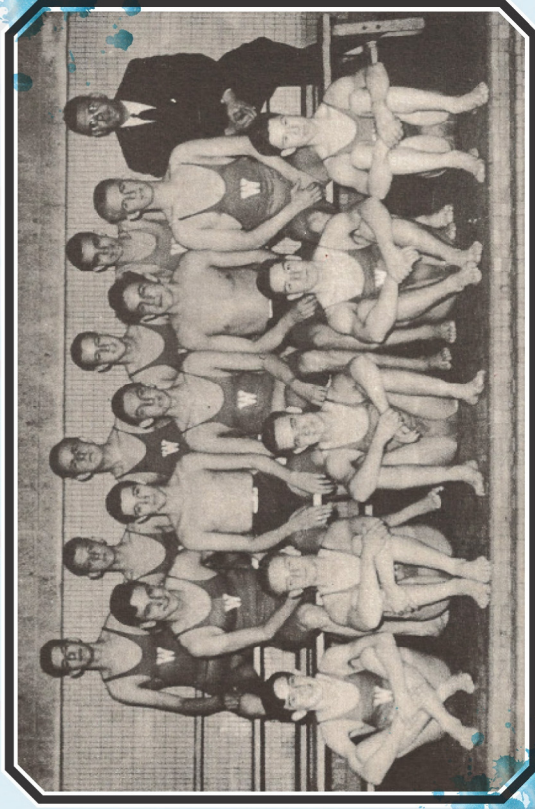
